

## HISTORY OF CAIRNGORM CC

Cairngorm CC was formed by Tom Mackie in 1970<sup>1</sup>. The first club race under NOSCA and SCU rules was a 25-mile TT in May 1970 from Loch Alvie to Newtonmore and back with about 30 entrants. The first 10-mile TT was from Rothiemurchus to Glenmore and back which is very similar to our current club 10. The hill climb has also been in use since the early days of the club.

Listed below are some of the courses and races promoted by the club since its formation.

### SQUARE FAYRE RACE

This 45 mile race took place at the same time as the Grantown Fayre and consisted of 6 laps of a Grantown-Cromdale loop, passing through Grantown on each lap. It was promoted by the Strathspey Round Table and organised by Colin Horn.

### CAIRNGORM HILL CLIMB

A TT of approximately 9 miles (13km) which follows the Ski Road from the east end of the slip road for the Coylumbridge hotel to its end at the entrance to the Coire Cas car park. Its first known use was in 1975 and it has always been part of the club race weekend. Results records are available from 1998 to present day. Adam Wild (GS Metro) set the male record in 2019 with a time of 25:11 and Lynsey Curran (Dooleys Cycles) the female record in 2014 with a time of 29:22.

### SPEY VALLEY RACING WEEKEND

This was a 1-off event in 1986 and effectively a dry run for the Tour of Speyside which started the following year. It comprised a Cairngorm Hill Climb, a Criterium around the Stakis hotel centre in Aviemore and a 33-mile TT from Grantown to Aviemore returning via Coylumbridge and Nethy Bridge. A 30-minute video of this event can be found on the website.

### TOUR OF SPEYSIDE

The description 'Tour of Speyside' was used in connection with the first known Cairngorm Hill Climb TT in 1975<sup>2</sup>. However, it generally refers to the event initiated by Colin Horn which ran for 10 years from 1987 and regularly attracted around 60 riders competing in a Tour de France style event with 4 distinct races over a weekend. The race sequence changed over the years but typically included a 50-mile road race, the 8-mile Cairngorm hill climb TT, a 70-mile road race and a 1 hour criterium. Riders could compete individually for the yellow or green jersey, points on sprint stages and also take part in the team competition. Colin's meticulous organisation and record keeping means that we still have race booklets, manuals and full results for all 10 years of the event. Looking through the results it is reassuring to discover that even back then riders with sticky bottles were being given time penalties for drafting team cars. Nothing really changes! On one occasion of the 70-mile race the Glen Truim single track road was being resurfaced and the riders had no choice but to continue over a section of road with absolutely no top surface, leading the Chief Commissaire (Tommy Bruce) to nickname it 'The Hell of the North'.

### CROMDALE 10

This TT started at the 30 signs on the A939 out of Grantown to a turn in the road after 5 ¼ miles and finished on the bridge over the Spey. (Presumably pre-dating the Cromdale traffic lights!) It is known<sup>3</sup> to have been on the NOSCA calendar for 1991 but its history before or after this date is uncertain.

### KINCRAIG 10

A 10 mile out and back TT on the B9152 with the start line adjacent to the Suidh Hotel, Kincaig. The route heads south to a dead turn in the road at Kingussie with the out leg slightly longer than the return, so the finish line is before you get back to the start area.

This course is known to have been used by the club since at least 1991 though prior to 2000 the club used a Carrbridge 10 for its race weekend<sup>4</sup>. Adam Wild (GS Metro) set the male record in 2019 with a time of 20:06 and Lynsey Curran (Dooleys Cycles) the female record in 2014 with a time of 23:58 [matched by Amanda Tweedie (RT23) in 2017].

#### APR

The first APR was in 1976 but there are no records of others until the 2000 race weekend, when the course is believed to have been 2 laps of the Kincaig loop, though there may also have been an APR in July 1999. The current course heads S on the B9152 from Kincaig into Kingussie, with a left at Duke Street, right onto Spey Street and left onto Station Road. It crosses the level crossing and follows the B970 out of Kingussie, past Ruthven Barracks and through Insh to turn left by Insh Hall and the descent to Loch Insh. It crosses the end of the loch on the long road bridge and climbs up The Brae to the T junction with the B9152 (one lap completed) to turn left. The race continues for most of a second lap with the finish being almost at the top of The Brae in Kincaig, by the entrance to the Ossian.

#### SALLY ANNE LOWE MEMORIAL WOMEN'S ROAD RACE

This race was established in 2014 in memorial of Sally Anne Lowe (partner of CCC club chairman, Iain Kenneth) tragically killed in 2013 when struck by a car while on her bike. It uses the same course as the APR and in recent years has also been event 5 of the Scottish National Women's Series and the Scottish Veteran Women's Road Race Championship.

#### THE MACKIE TROPHY (formerly George Edwards Memorial)

A TT of approximately 14 miles (22km) starting on the B970 outside Corrou House, Rothiemurchus. It heads west to the Aviemore roundabout then south on the B9152 to Kincaig, left at the war memorial on the unclassified road through Kincaig and on to the junction with B970. Then left and follow B970 north to finish 150 metres before main Inverdrue junction. (The original course started and finished at Corrou House but was changed in 2006 for safety reasons). Early club records generally refer to this course as 'the loop' however in 1993 a trophy was purchased in memorial of club member and former Scottish and British road champion George Edwards. In 2002 club founder Tom Mackie made a new trophy and from 2003 the event became the Mackie Trophy. Results records are available for every year from 1998 to the present day<sup>5</sup>. Adam Wild (GS Metro) set the male record in 2019 with a time of 29:27 and Lynsey Curran (Dooleys Cycles) the female record in 2014 with a time of 35:01.

## HISTORY OF CAIRNGORM CC

Cairngorm CC was formed by Tom Mackie in 1970<sup>1</sup>. The first club race under NOSCA and SCU rules was a 25-mile TT in May 1970 from Loch Alvie to Newtonmore and back with about 30 entrants. The first 10-mile TT was from Rothiemurchus to Glenmore and back which is very similar to our current club 10. The hill climb has also been in use since the early days of the club.

Listed below are some of the courses and races promoted by the club since its formation.

### SQUARE FAYRE RACE

This 45 mile race took place at the same time as the Grantown Fayre and consisted of 6 laps of a Grantown-Cromdale loop, passing through Grantown on each lap. It was promoted by the Strathspey Round Table and organised by Colin Horn.

### CAIRNGORM HILL CLIMB

A TT of approximately 9 miles (13km) which follows the Ski Road from the east end of the slip road for the Coylumbridge hotel to its end at the entrance to the Coire Cas car park. Its first known use was in 1975 and it has always been part of the club race weekend. Results records are available from 1998 to present day. Adam Wild (GS Metro) set the male record in 2019 with a time of 25:11 and Lynsey Curran (Dooleys Cycles) the female record in 2014 with a time of 29:22.

### SPEY VALLEY RACING WEEKEND

This was a 1-off event in 1986 and effectively a dry run for the Tour of Speyside which started the following year. It comprised a Cairngorm Hill Climb, a Criterium around the Stakis hotel centre in Aviemore and a 33-mile TT from Grantown to Aviemore returning via Coylumbridge and Nethy Bridge. A 30-minute video of this event can be found on the website.

### TOUR OF SPEYSIDE

The description 'Tour of Speyside' was used in connection with the first known Cairngorm Hill Climb TT in 1975<sup>2</sup>. However, it generally refers to the event initiated by Colin Horn which ran for 10 years from 1987 and regularly attracted around 60 riders competing in a Tour de France style event with 4 distinct races over a weekend. The race sequence changed over the years but typically included a 50-mile road race, the 8-mile Cairngorm hill climb TT, a 70-mile road race and a 1 hour criterium. Riders could compete individually for the yellow or green jersey, points on sprint stages and also take part in the team competition. Colin's meticulous organisation and record keeping means that we still have race booklets, manuals and full results for all 10 years of the event. Looking through the results it is reassuring to discover that even back then riders with sticky bottles were being given time penalties for drafting team cars. Nothing really changes! On one occasion of the 70-mile race the Glen Truim single track road was being resurfaced and the riders had no choice but to continue over a section of road with absolutely no top surface, leading the Chief Commissaire (Tommy Bruce) to nickname it 'The Hell of the North'.

### CROMDALE 10

This TT started at the 30 signs on the A939 out of Grantown to a turn in the road after 5 ¼ miles and finished on the bridge over the Spey. (Presumably pre-dating the Cromdale traffic lights!) It is known<sup>3</sup> to have been on the NOSCA calendar for 1991 but its history before or after this date is uncertain.

### KINCRAIG 10

A 10 mile out and back TT on the B9152 with the start line adjacent to the Suidh Hotel, Kincaig. The route heads south to a dead turn in the road at Kingussie with the out leg slightly longer than the return, so the finish line is before you get back to the start area.

This course is known to have been used by the club since at least 1991 though prior to 2000 the club used a Carrbridge 10 for its race weekend<sup>4</sup>. Adam Wild (GS Metro) set the male record in 2019 with a time of 20:06 and Lynsey Curran (Dooleys Cycles) the female record in 2014 with a time of 23:58 [matched by Amanda Tweedie (RT23) in 2017].

#### APR

The first APR was in 1976 but there are no records of others until the 2000 race weekend, when the course is believed to have been 2 laps of the Kincaig loop, though there may also have been an APR in July 1999. The current course heads S on the B9152 from Kincaig into Kingussie, with a left at Duke Street, right onto Spey Street and left onto Station Road. It crosses the level crossing and follows the B970 out of Kingussie, past Ruthven Barracks and through Insh to turn left by Insh Hall and the descent to Loch Insh. It crosses the end of the loch on the long road bridge and climbs up The Brae to the T junction with the B9152 (one lap completed) to turn left. The race continues for most of a second lap with the finish being almost at the top of The Brae in Kincaig, by the entrance to the Ossian.

#### SALLY ANNE LOWE MEMORIAL WOMEN'S ROAD RACE

This race was established in 2014 in memorial of Sally Anne Lowe (partner of CCC club chairman, Iain Kenneth) tragically killed in 2013 when struck by a car while on her bike. It uses the same course as the APR and in recent years has also been event 5 of the Scottish National Women's Series and the Scottish Veteran Women's Road Race Championship.

#### THE MACKIE TROPHY (formerly George Edwards Memorial)

A TT of approximately 14 miles (22km) starting on the B970 outside Corrou House, Rothiemurchus. It heads west to the Aviemore roundabout then south on the B9152 to Kincaig, left at the war memorial on the unclassified road through Kincaig and on to the junction with B970. Then left and follow B970 north to finish 150 metres before main Inverdrue junction. (The original course started and finished at Corrou House but was changed in 2006 for safety reasons). Early club records generally refer to this course as 'the loop' however in 1993 a trophy was purchased in memorial of club member and former Scottish and British road champion George Edwards. In 2002 club founder Tom Mackie made a new trophy and from 2003 the event became the Mackie Trophy. Results records are available for every year from 1998 to the present day<sup>5</sup>. Adam Wild (GS Metro) set the male record in 2019 with a time of 29:27 and Lynsey Curran (Dooleys Cycles) the female record in 2014 with a time of 35:01.
