




TOUR OF SPEYSIDE

WHAT IS A MULTI-STAGE CYCLE RACE?

Well, the STAKIS Tour of Speyside is based on the Tour de France, albeit, a bit smaller.

Our race has four stages — two on Saturday and two on Sunday and each stage is an independent race.

Stage one — the Badenoch stage — sponsored by Stakis Badenoch Hotel, is a 50 mile massed start road race. A maximum of 60 riders will start and prizes are won by the first six to finish and a time is recorded for every rider. Also the first three finishers are given a time bonus which is deducted from their time (10 seconds for 1st place, 6 seconds for 2nd place and 4 seconds for 3rd place). The rider with the least time becomes the Race Leader and is presented with a Yellow Jersey which he must wear in the next stage.

Stage two — the Aviemore stage — sponsored by Stakis Four Seasons Hotel and based on the previous 'AVIEMORE CRITERIUM', is run round the Aviemore Centre for one hour. The circular road will be closed to other traffic but should there be an emergency (fire or ambulance) the race would be stopped and the road opened. The race is a massed start with prizes awarded to the first six finishers plus time bonuses for the first three. A time is recorded for every rider and added to the stage one time to produce the General Classification. The rider with the least time becomes the Race Leader and another Yellow Jersey is presented.

Stage three — the Strathspey stage — sponsored by Beale & Pyper, Grantown-on-Spey, is the longest stage being a 66 mile massed start road race. Prizes and time bonuses are won by the first few riders and again the stage times are added together to produce the 'Gen. Class.' and the Race Leader.

Stage four — the Cairngorm stage — sponsored by Stakis Coylumbridge Resort Hotel — is very different. This stage is an 8 mile individual time trial where the riders start at one minute intervals and race against the clock from Coylumbridge Hotel to the Ski Car Park at Mount Cairngorm. No time bonuses are awarded on this stage only prizes for the six fastest.

Once the Race Officials have done their sums and produced the final 'Gen. Class.' a worthy winner will emerge.

Two other competitions have been running during the race. The 'Osprey Challenge' points competition — sponsored by Sunseeker Leisure, Aviemore Holiday Park, is an individual competition based on points won at selected places during stages one, two and three. The Leader in the points can be recognised by the Green Jersey.

The other competition is the 'Monadhliath' team competition — sponsored by Coylumbridge Highland Lodges Timeshare Development. A team consists of four riders. The race times of the best three in every stage are added together and the winners are the team having the least time after the four stages.

STAGE DETAILS:-

STAGE 1. THE BADENOCH STAGE – sponsored by: STAKIS BADENOCH HOTEL, Aviemore Centre

Start 10.00am Saturday 20th June 1987 at The Aviemore Centre. B970 to Kincraig. B9152 to Kingussie, Newtonmore, A86 to Laggan, and unclassified road to Glentruim, A9 and B9152 to Newtonmore, Kingussie, Kincraig, Aviemore to Finish at The Aviemore Centre — Distance 52 MILES.

STAGE 2. THE AVIEMORE STAGE – sponsored by: STAKIS FOUR SEASONS HOTEL

Start 7.00pm Saturday 20th June 1987 at The Aviemore Centre. Race round the 0.8 mile circuit around the Aviemore Centre. — Distance 1 hour.

STAGE 3. THE STRATHSPEY STAGE – sponsored by: BEALE & PYPER. Grantown on Spey

Start 9.00am Sunday 21st June 1987 at The Aviemore Centre. B9152, A95, B9153 to Carrbridge. A938, A95 to Grantown on Spey. Twice round an 8 mile circuit via Grantown on Spey. B970 to Nethybridge, detour past Loch Garten, B970 to Boat of Garten, A95 to Kinveachy, Aviemore to finish at The Aviemore Centre. Distance 70 MILES.

STAGE 4. THE CAIRNGORM STAGE – sponsored by: STAKIS COYLUMBRIDGE RESORT HOTEL, Aviemore

Start 2.30pm Sunday 21st June 1987 at Coylumbridge Hotel. Finish at the ski car park, Mount Cairngorm. Distance 8 MILES, individual Time Trial.

Cycle sport, in common with most or sports, has it's own language, here are a few of the words that our Announcer may use:-

Break A small group of riders that accelerate away from

the main bunch of competitors.

Bunch Main group of riders in the race. Also called the

pack or the peloton.

Commissaire The official or referee who is in charge of a cycle

race.

Criterium A race held on a short circuit in a town or village.

Echelon Term used to explain the slanting line of racers to

combat a cross-wind.

General Classification

(or G.C.) Overall positions in a stage race decided by the

total accumulated time of each rider on each stage. The Leader on G.C. wears the Yellow

Jersey.

Green Jersey Racing jersey awarded to the rider who has

accumulated the largest number of points.

HOT SPOT A sprint during a race for which points are

awarded.

Prime French word (pronounced 'preem'). A sprint at the

top of a hill for which points are awarded.

Broom Wagon Vehicle that follows the last group of riders in case

one has to quit the race.

Time Trial Race in which each competitor rides alone and is

timed over a set distance, with the winner being

the one who has the shortest time.
