WHAT IS A MULTI-STAGE CYCLE RACE?

Well, the STAKIS Tour of Speyside is based on the Tour de France, albeit, a bit smaller.

Our race has four Stages - two on Saturday and two on Sunday. Each Stage is an independent race.

Stage one - the Badenoch Stage - sponsored jointly by J.K. Robinson, Building Contractors, Newtonmore, and the Bank of Scotland, Kingussie and Newtonmore branches, is a 50 mile massed start road race. A maximum of 60 riders will start and prizes are won by the first six to finish. A time is recorded for every rider. The first three finishers are given a time bonus which is deducted from their time (15 seconds for 1st. place, 10 seconds for 2nd. place and 5 seconds for 3rd. place). The rider with the least time becomes the Race Leader and is presented with a Yellow Jersey which he must wear in the next Stage.

Stage two - the Cairngorm Stage - sponsored by STAKIS Coylumbridge Resort Hotel, is very different. This stage is an 8 mile individual Time Trial where the riders start at one minute intervals and race against the clock from Coylumbridge Hotel to the Ski Car Park at Mount Cairngorm. No time bonuses are awarded on this Stage, only prizes for the six fastest.

The time taken to climb the mountain is added to the Stage one time to produce the General Classification. The rider with the least time becomes the Race Leader and another Yellow Jersey is presented.

Stage three - the Strathspey Stage - sponsored by Beale & Pyper, House Furnishers, Grantown on Spey, is the longest Stage being a 70 mile massed start Road Race. Prizes and time bonuses are won by the first few riders and again the Stage times are added together to produce the 'Gen. Class.' and the Race Leader.

Stage four - the Aviemore Stage - sponsored by STAKIS Four Seasons Hotel, is run round the Aviemore Centre for one hour. The circular road will be closed to other traffic but should there be an emergency (fire or ambulance) the race would be stopped and the road opened. The race is a massed start with prizes and time bonuses awarded to the first few riders. Once the Race Officials have done their sums and produced the final 'Gen. Class.' a worthy winner will emerge.

Two other competitions will be running during the race. The 'Osprey Challenge' points competition - sponsored by STAKIS Badenoch Hotel, is an individual competition based on points won at select places during Stages one, three and four, and for the fastest times over the first five miles of Stage two. The Leader in the points competition can be recognised by the Green Jersey. Time bonuses are also awarded which go towards the 'Gen. Class.' competition.

The other competition is the 'Monadhliath' team competition - sponsored by Coylumbridge Highland Lodges Timeshare Development. A team consists of four riders. The race times of the best three in every Stage are added together and the winners are the team having the least time after the four Stages.

the main bunch of competitors.

Bunch Main group of riders in the race. Also called the

pack or the peloton.

Commissaire The official or referee who is in charge of a cycle

race.

Criterium A race held on a short circuit in a town or village.

Echelon Term used to explain the slanting line of racers to

combat a cross-wind.

General Classification

(or G.C.) Overall positions in a stage race decided by the

total accumulated time of each rider on each stage. The Leader on G.C. wears the Yellow

Jersey.

Green Jersey Racing jersey awarded to the rider who has

accumulated the largest number of points.

HOT SPOT A sprint during a race for which points are

awarded.

Prime French word (pronounced 'preem'). A sprint at the

top of a hill for which points are awarded.

Broom Wagon Vehicle that follows the last group of riders in case

one has to quit the race.

Time Trial Race in which each competitor rides alone and is

timed over a set distance, with the winner being

the one who has the shortest time.
